# A NOTE FROM *Pastor Ginger*

These words of scripture were written to a people who had been exiled from their homeland, disconnected from the center of their religious life, and thrown into a world that was unfamiliar.

Though many of our congregation have not experienced being driven from our home and country, over the past couple years of COVID quarantine — with its disruptions, adjustments, and losses — the context of this scripture from Jeremiah still has resonance. Everything has changed.

In Jeremiah 29, God tells the people in exile — and us! — to live fully and pay attention to the people and realities that need care right where we are and in the present moment. And to trust in God's promise of a hope-filled future. That is the guidance we receive for this turbulent and disruptive time in human history. And that is what we plan to do as we move into 2023.





The pandemic has highlighted just how lonely and in need of community we are, and reminds us of what a gift we have in Foundry! Foundry will focus on celebrating and sharing life together through:

- Large and small group fun events
- Multiplication of small groups

- Increasing engagement in short and long-term service projects
- Improving all the ways we welcome and help new people experience our life together as Foundry including
- A vibrant youth group and children's ministry that helps our young people connect with God and each other

People are feeling disconnected from life-giving spiritual practices and holy habits. Foundry will offer:

- Transcendent worship in person, live online, and on demand
- Retreats to renew body and soul, including the return of the Women's Retreat and at least one congregational spiritual retreat that I will facilitate
- Classes to guide us into deeper understanding, questioning, and faith
- Children's Worship and Sunday School

Many yearn to discover how to make a difference amidst so much challenge and injustice in the world. Foundry will provide:

- Opportunities for both direct service with the most vulnerable and engagement with long-term advocacy to move the needle on harmful and unjust policies and practices
- Ways to identify and share our passions and skills for service as part of Foundry on missional priorities both inside and outside the walls — and potentially internationally
- Meaningful conversations, studies, and trainings to help us meet our goal of embedding racial equity and justice in the DNA of Foundry

In the next year, you'll have increased opportunities to engage and to support Foundry being...Foundry!

It is your faithful generosity that makes all this possible. We are deeply grateful for your support, no matter what you give. By receiving estimates of giving, we can enter into 2023 knowing the amount of resources we have to work with, helping put these plans for our future with hope into action. 

# Organizing for a future with hope

## Social Justice



Your gifts enable Foundry Social Justice to continue to engage in direct service and powerful community partnerships to organize for a future with hope. We know that serving others is a core way we serve God. Our ministries have endured throughout the pandemic to ensure vital services are delivered. At the same time, our organizing partnerships and collaborative work within the community have resulted in substantial advancements for justice.

### WE CONTINUE TO REMOVE BARRIERS

- Our ID Ministry served over 1,000 neighbors, assisting them in obtaining important documents such as ID cards and birth certificates. Leaders from Foundry ID ministry continued to give leadership through presenting at policy forums and submitting testimony illustrating the experience of ID guests
- Foundry's Executive Director of Programs and Justice, Rev. Ben Roberts, submitted testimony and continued to offer leadership in the public square and presenting to policy makers. This included:

## WE ENGAGE OUR ROOTS THROUGH PUBLIC WITNESS

- After examining acts of faithful witness through reading "Chocolate City: A History of Race and Democracy in the Nation's Capital" and attending the William Astor & Vivian T. Kirk Symposium Lecture, the Sacred Resistance team hosted a Session on the Wesleyan Roots of Public Witness featuring General Secretary Dr. Ashley Boggan Dreff of the General Commission on Archives and History for the United Methodist Church

- As an act of public witness with government leaders, Foundry's pastoral staff helped lead the Washington Interfaith Network (WIN) action on March 20, 2022. Candidates for Mayor, DC Attorney General, and Council Chair were present. We gathered over a hundred Foundry participants in this act of public witness





- Building off our roots of public witness sessions; Lay leadership, Pastors Ben and Ginger held our first-ever Table Flip Sunday act of public witness on April 10. Like Jesus did in the Temple, we cleared tables of things that divide and destroy, replacing them with objects that represent our vision for a more just vision of life together
- Sacred Resistance Ministries continued its engagement for racial justice through participation with Washington Interfaith Network who successfully advanced efforts of Black Equity Through Housing

### WE PROVIDE LEADERSHIP WITH UNITED METHODIST PARTNERS

- In coordination with Foundry's Annual Conference Delegation, we crafted and submitted a resolution on Housing Security
- During the summer of 2022, we resumed in-person volunteer efforts with Project Transformation DC, reading with elementary-aged children to fight the summer literacy slide

### WE USE OUR GIFTS AND SERVICE TO BUILD UP NEIGHBORS

- Our spring Great Day of Service hosted over 90 volunteers who packed meals to send to East Timor. Our Sandwich 1,000 and Christ House cooking ministries also returned to work in their community partnerships
- In February 2022, English as a Second Language classes returned after a two-year hiatus, and we helped 60 new people learn English. We've now hosted two semesters of ESL this calendar year, and the program continues to regain strength
- Foundry held space for immigrant intake efforts with community partners after migrants began being bused to Washington, D.C. from Texas and Arizona

- We worked with lay leadership to continue to receive clothing donations to help supply adult clothing to community partners at Charlie's Place

### YOUR GIFTS AT WORK IN 2023

- Our Religion and Racial Justice Committee will offer training with key leaders, clergy and staff to build leadership foundations for the continued implementation of the Journey to Racial Justice strategic goals
- We will add Saturdays back to our ID Ministry schedule in fall 2022, allowing us to provide even more volunteer opportunities and capacity to assist our neighbors in obtaining life documents. We will also continue our current Friday ID Ministry hours
- Continue to integrate goals of green ministry team through focused opportunities for service like our sustainable coffee hour and Green Great Day of Service
- Add education opportunities through the Sacred Resistance team to explore faith foundations around efforts for reproductive health and choice, international peace, ending homelessness, immigration, and environmental stewardship
- Reengage efforts from 2019 to develop an international missional partnership opportunity aligned with areas of focus related to immigration, environment, and international peace
- Expand opportunities of volunteer service by engaging with organizations and service opportunities where Foundry members already serve

## Music and Worship Arts

Foundry's Music and Worship Arts team brought their talented musicians, lay leaders and clergy back into our Sanctuary with the powerful music ministry that Foundry has become known for. Under the leadership of Stanley Thurston, our director of music and worship arts, your gifts allowed us to offer special worship experiences, new opportunities for lay leadership, and unique opportunities to hear from renowned speakers and artists. Whether you were in our Sanctuary or connected digitally across the world, we hope you felt united, inspired, and hopeful.

### WE CRAFT JOYFUL WORSHIP AND MUSIC EXPERIENCES

- Offered meaningful weekly worship experiences and special music and worship visuals for All Saints', Advent, Lent, Good Friday, and Easter, complete with choirs, soloists, and instrumentalists
- Staged a dramatic, multi-sensory Good Friday musical service drawing on the talents of choir, lay readers, and guest instrumentalists
- Reimagined our Adult Choirs as a single, united Music Ministry, "The Foundry Choir"
- Hosted a Spirituals Workshop in collaboration with the Heritage Signature Chorale and Cathedral Choral Society

- Offered American Sign Language (ASL) interpretation at each 11:15 a.m. worship service, both in person and online

### WE CREATE NEW LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

- Expanded Lay Music & Worship Teams for the curation and development of Music & Worship Arts
- Launched the Worship and Sunday Morning Ministry Team, bringing together a coordinating body of Music and Worship teams, along with our ushers, greeters, and the Sunday Morning Prayer team



### WE PASS THE MIC TO TALENTED SPEAKERS AND MUSICIANS

- Hosted over 400 people in our Sanctuary for a festival of African American song
- Partnered with the Poor People's Campaign and Rev. Dr. William Barber for a special Pentecost service and public action
- Invited Bishop Marcus Matthews to preach at both services for both Martin Luther King Jr. Weekend and Human Relations Sunday
- With many in attendance in person and online, we hosted a concert featuring organ recitalist Eileen Guenther
- Collaborated with multiple local choirs to participate in Bernstein's Mass at the 50th Anniversary of the Kennedy Center

# Hospitality and Congregational Care

At Foundry, we honor humanity as well as divinity as we care for the human needs within our congregation. Your gifts help our Hospitality and Congregational Care Ministry teams enable connection and support at every stage of life's journey. Our ministers of prayer, card ministry, new members classes, and weekly prayer team meetings keep us connected to God and one another in ever deepening ways. And there's room to grow.

### WE CARE FOR LIFE'S STAGES

- Gathered with 16 couples preparing to wed during our Pre-Cana marriage retreats to discuss topics such as finance, personality, relationship, and counseling
- Celebrated the weddings of 10 couples on site at Foundry

### WE DEEPEN OUR RELATIONSHIPS

- Introduced 28 people to membership at Foundry through our Pastor's Coffee event for prospective new members
- Taught four "A Disciple's Path" membership classes with a total of 71 participants

## WE PRAY WITH AND FOR EACH OTHER

- Care and Prayer Ministries continued to hold two weekly rounds of prayer, as well as regular check-ins and calls with those in need of pastoral support
- Our Card Team wrote and mailed hundreds of cards to those celebrating, mourning, or going through a tough time
- Offered Ministers of Prayer in each worship service, and encouraged people to talk to them
- Clergy team prayed weekly for an average of 60 prayer requests

## YOUR GIFTS AT WORK IN 2023

- Complete the process of recruiting and training Stephens Ministers so that we have an active team of Stephens Ministers in 2023
- Utilize the Ministry Engagement Survey results to expand opportunities of service as Ushers and Greeters
- Coordinate Sunday Morning ministries of hospitality and care through the new Worship and Sunday Morning Ministry Team



- Build on the newly-formed Membership Ministry Team to manage membership data, follow up with visitors and guests, help facilitate ministry connections through the Foundry Ministry Engagement Survey, support the A Disciple's Path process, and more
- Continue to offer opportunities for increased lay participation in hospitality offerings such as Coffee Hour
- Continue to host opportunities to connect with God and one another through new members' class, life stage retreats like Pre-Cana, and surrounding one another at every stage of life's journey

## Discipleship



Over the past year, your support helped our Discipleship Ministries team bring people together in new ways while also reviving some of the gatherings that we missed during the pandemic. In July 2022, Foundry welcomed Rev. Jonathan Brown as our new Associate Pastor and Director of Discipleship Ministries. We look forward to how he and our lay teams will help us continue to cultivate a future with hope, for all in the Foundry family.

### WE LEARN TOGETHER

- Had 49 participants in our reading groups for "Chocolate City: A History of Race and Democracy in the Nation's Capital"
- Welcomed 60 participants for the William Astor and Vivian T. Kirk Master Class (featuring Dr. Chris Myers Asch and Dr. George Derek Musgrove)
- Hosted 174 attendees for the William Astor and Vivian T. Kirk Symposium Lecture with Drs. Asch and Musgrove, both in person and virtually
- Celebrated 22 persons finishing multiple Disciple Bible Study courses (between two and six courses completed)
- Journeyed with 54 people in a study of Thomas Merton's "Seeds of Contemplation," led by Anthony Gaines Cirelli
- Began a new journey of Disciple I with 15 members

### WE GATHER IN FELLOWSHIP

- Our LGBTQIA+ potlucks returned from pandemic hiatus to in-person gatherings
- Established the Foundry Writer's Group from a seed that was developed in the creation of the Lenten Devotional
- Continued facilitating various Small Groups across the DMV

## YOUR GIFTS AT WORK IN 2023

- Launching a series of hybrid six-week and seven-week classes during our education hour on Sunday mornings
- Introducing new Small Groups and Fellowship Groups that are focused on common interests
- Celebrating the return of in-person retreats, beginning with the Women's Retreat in February 2023
- Establishing a variety of virtual, in-person, and hybrid adult educational offerings so that all feel welcome, safe, and included
- Launch a "Fresh Expressions" course by January 2023

# Family Ministries

In the last year, Foundry's Family Ministries have been a steady and loving place for spiritual growth both in the church and in our homes. We have welcomed back some of our familiar ministries and created new ministry spaces through collaboration and innovation. Because of your generosity, Foundry's Family Ministries continues to cultivate and grow a future with hope.

## WE CREATE AN ENVIRONMENT FOR OUR YOUTH TO LEAD US

- Confirmed three youth
- Provided 175+ hours of youth engagement, education, and fellowship
- Hosted eight youth and two youth leaders at Manidokan Camp and Retreat Center for a Spring Retreat focused on Baptism
- Took 19 youth and servant leaders to Clay County, West Virginia for the summer 2022 Appalachia Service Project
- Hosted a cohort of five Foundry Youth and two youth leaders for Youth Local Mission, a weeklong event focusing on the intersections

of faith and public policy through interviews with local and national leaders, service opportunities, and leadership development

Guests included: Councilmember Brianne Nadeau; Marielle Rabins, policy advisor to Senator Elizabeth Warren; Rev. Thomas Bowen from the D.C. Mayor's Office; Elliott Smith, National Youth Organizer for the Poor People's Campaign; Steven Adair from UMCOMM; and Dr. Jessie Smith from the General Board of Church and Society

## WE TEACH, SUPPORT, AND HAVE FUN WITH OUR KIDS

- Partnered with Stead Park on three community events: Holiday Café, Egg Hunt, and Capital PRIDE Family Zone
- Developed sensory bags for our Foundry Kids during worship
- Hired two educators who now bring their experience and expertise to our Childcare Center
- Developed and soft-launched a dedicated Children's Worship space for our Foundry Kids that utilizes the "7 Theological C's" and Godly Play to encourage worship and wonder
- Distributed 3rd grade Bibles to incoming 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders

## WE BRING GENERATIONS TOGETHER

- Brought 70+ Foundry members of all ages together for Family Camp at West River

## WE SUPPORT PARENTS AT EVERY STAGE OF THEIR JOURNEY

- Continued a parent small group for parents of kids of all ages
- Began a series of Parenting Seminars which will feature special guests: Rev. Rachel Cornwell and Rebecca Stevens-Walter, a children's liberation theologian

# Communications

This year, your gifts helped our Communications team focus on direct communication with our congregation, widening our overall online reach, streamlining processes with smart technology, and enriching the worship experience for all, both in person or online. Kaylon Rutledge, who leads our Communications efforts, was joined by Bryan Villarroel in this effort as he joined the team as Project Manager for Digital Engagement in Fall 2021. With increased global web and social media traffic, a focus on accessibility, and more efficient processes, Foundry Communications is proud to be connecting to a future with hope.

## WE KEEP THE FOUNDRY COMMUNITY UPDATED

- Worked with the Reentry Implementation Task Force to carry out our Turning the Corner Together campaign, keeping stakeholders updated on reentry plans and Covid protocols. This included a Covid section of the website, regular email updates, and print collateral such as pop-up banners displaying safety protocols, directional signage, and mask requirement notices
- Kept our congregation and community updated with weekly newsletters: All Things Foundry and Today at Foundry, as well as monthly updates: The Forge and the Social Justice newsletter
- Carried out last year's Preparing the Table with Justice and Joy campaign: the production of our booklets, email and social media campaigns, and videos that had a combined 2,584 views

## WE WIDEN OUR ONLINE REACH

- Foundry's YouTube videos had over 28,000 views this year — accounting for over 9,200 hours of viewership. These numbers remained steady, even after we began offering in-person worship again. We had 167 new YouTube subscribers
- Foundry Facebook and Instagram content reached a combined 109,409 users

- Added new interactive pieces to our website, including an updated "Our Team" page with new headshots and biographies, and an events page. These two new sections alone accounted for 15,207 website page views. That, along with SEO updates, helped account for an overall 20% increase in website traffic, with 120,235 views in the past year

## WE ENRICH THE FOUNDRY EXPERIENCE — IN PERSON AND ONLINE

- Produced original branding and graphics for 10 worship series, which appeared across our digital platforms and in two worship guides: a printed version for in-person use and a digital version for online use
- Hosted online worship services, which garnered an average of 1,500 online views across YouTube, Church Online and Facebook for each service
- Worked with the Discipleship team to create and distribute the 2021 Lenten Devotional, both in print format and via daily emails. 140 print copies were distributed, and 108 people signed up to receive them via email. Devotional emails had an average 80% open rate, a 30% increase from last year
- Worked with Foxall Society to host three educational webinars focused on finances, estate planning, and insurance



### WE STREAMLINE PROCESSES WITH TECHNOLOGY

- Worked with Nominating Committee and ministry area directors to create online congregational engagement survey, which received over 90 responses within the first three weeks of opening

- Carried out a multi-platform campaign to encourage members to move their directory info from Adjace to Church Center. So far, 285 people have opted in
- Made church conference voting more efficient by creating a digital ballot and counting system

- Using different types of interactive media, tell the story of Foundry — our clergy, staff, congregation, and community impact — in a way that reaches people where they are
- Create more opportunities for digital engagement outside of Sunday worship
- Deepen our commitment to digital accessibility by completing our web and social media accessibility audit, and user testing the full website
- Replace all indoor and outdoor building signage to reflect new Foundry branding, include Spanish translations, and braille where accessible
- Engage the gifts of our newly-formed Communications Ministry team through our five recently established sub-teams: Photography/Videography, Data Team, Digital Strategists, Writers, and Social Media Ambassadors

# Operations and Impact



Our Operations and Impact teams continue to focus on making our facilities and financial operations more sustainable, equitable, and reflective of our values. This past year, we have taken calculated measures to reduce our overall carbon footprint, allocated budgeted funds to local businesses, and partnered with neighbors who share our values, all with a balanced budget.



## WE REFLECT OUR VALUES THROUGH OUR OPERATIONS AND FINANCES

- In collaboration with the Personnel Committee and Board, drafted a new Personnel Handbook that included a new Telework policy and updated federal holidays
- Developed and implemented a Capital Expenditure Budget to care for ongoing facility repairs and improvements
- Fully funded the Capital Reserves account to help care for ongoing facility improvements
- Completed the 2021 financial audit with successful outcomes and ended the year with a \$386,997 surplus
- Engaged 84 new donors
- Hosted Holiday Thyme — an African American, woman-owned business, founded by trained chefs and food enthusiasts — in the Foundry kitchen. This partnership aims to create more Black representation in the culinary industry and to create educational opportunities for up-and-coming chefs

## WE CARE FOR OUR FACILITIES WHILE CARING FOR CREATION

- 2022 Green Generations Creation Care Improvements have included:
  - Safely installed a 156-ton energy efficient chiller resulting in 6.2% reduced energy costs and a \$14,000 rebate
  - Installed and retrofitted all facility lighting fixtures to LED, resulting in a projected 50,602 kWh reduction and \$6,651 in cost savings
  - Installed 130 energy-efficient, custom fit window inserts projected to help create a 13,836 kWh reduction in energy and \$3,064 in cost savings
- Reduced our energy use by 16.9%, resulting in \$17,684 in total energy cost reduction

OVERALL, WE REDUCED OUR CARBON FOOTPRINT BY 45,424 KG CO2



- Partnered with neighbor organization Vital Voices to procure a Skilled Technician for facility maintenance
- Hosted D.C. Independent Film Festival's Summer 2022 Filmmaking Course for High School youth
- Provided space for Deaf Queer Resource Center and filmmaker Topher Ávila's documentary on the BIPOC Deaf LGBTQ Community

- Actively display Foundry's efforts to reduce our carbon footprint
- Collaborate with like-minded community groups to share space and resources for outreach
- Reduce paper waste by 40% by using only eco-friendly hospitality products
- Fully fund the Operating Reserves to target minimum

## Why make an Estimated Giving Contribution for 2023?

At Foundry, our single most important source of funding for our ministries comes from the estimated giving contributions during our annual stewardship campaign. Unlike some churches, we receive virtually no funds from an endowment. We are deeply grateful for the faithfulness of our congregation, as we have consistently received at minimum — a 90% fulfillment rate for all promised commitments. These commitments provide us with a forecast on which we build our expense budget for the coming year. We acknowledge each gift to be as unique as the individual giver, and we strive to be exceptional stewards of the resources entrusted to us.
