Because of your pledged gifts and these principles, the Board was able to adopt a balanced budget for 2021. This budget should ensure that our finances remain strong as we move toward 2022 when we start using general revenues to make loan payments which have, since 2015, been paid from funds contributed to Mission Possible.
