


Kevin Smalls

The Rev. Dr. B. Kevin Smalls is the senior pastor of Hope United Methodist Church in Southfield, Ml. He is a native of Washington, DC and is a clergy member in full connection in the Baltimore-Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Reverend Smalls grew up in the Washington, DC neighborhood, North Michigan Park and graduated from Theodore Roosevelt High School. Early in his teenage life, he answered the call to ordained ministry and in his senior year in high school he was elected the Chairperson of the Conference Council on Youth Ministry of the Baltimore Conference. One of the highlights of his teenage life was traveling to the then Soviet Union in 1988 with the Northeastern Jurisdiction Council on Youth Ministry of the United Methodist Church. There, he met Russian youth and was invited to preach in a Russian congregation. He preached in several congregations across the conference as a teenager and continued to do so prior to attending seminary.

While a student at Claflin University, in Orangeburg, SC where he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree with a major in history, he was certified as a candidate for ministry at 18 years of age. During his years at Claflin, a United Methodist historically black university, he itinerated with the Black College Fund of the United Methodist Church raising awareness of the need to support United Methodist black colleges and offerings words of gratitude to faithful supporters by speaking to various annual conferences across the connection.



Reverend Smalls has served congregations as pastor in Georgia, Maryland and just before his current appointment, was appointed to serve his home church, Ebenezer United Methodist Church on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC. He has also served as an associate council director of the Baltimore Washington Conference with the responsibility to build and support young adult ministry development.

In addition to a Bachelor's degree, he holds a Master's of Divinity

Degree with a concentration in preaching and worship from the

Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, Ga. and a doctor of
ministry degree from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio.

Kevin loves life and considers himself an amateur musician and poet. He enjoys the love of his four children, Kevin, Jr., Kailyn, Nicholas and Aiden.


