Fair Trade Sales



FEARLESS GENEROSITY: DEEPENING FAITH Campaign Update

Thank you to the 315 individuals and families who have already submitted an estimate of giving for 2020, we have received \$1.73 million in commitments for 2020. We are grateful for this tremendous show of support for Foundry's mission and ministries, but we're not finished vet. We still need \$170,000 more to reach our \$1.9 million financial goal and 85 more individuals and families to reach our goal of at least 400 submitted estimates. As we shared earlier in the campaign, it is critical that we reach this \$1.9 million goal as the Foundry Board has committed to passing a balanced budget for next year. The Board will meet on December 10th to consider a budget for 2020. Please help us reach our goal and ensure they have the full picture of expected giving for next year. 
Will Carden (joining and being baptized)
