IMPORTANT TRANSITION ON FOUNDRY'S MANAGEMENT BOARD

At the end of August, Board member and Personnel Co-Chair Samantha Sweeney submitted her resignation after much prayer and discernment. We have been blessed by Samantha's thoughtful, skilled insights into so many aspects of our shared work and by her leadership on Personnel Committee and as a member of the Beaumont Working Group. She has provided leadership in a very complicated and trying time in the life of our congregation. We are indebted to her and deeply grateful.

Following Foundry's Bylaws and at Pastor Ginger's request, the Executive Committee met to consider how to go about filling Samantha's large shoes. Our Bylaws allow the Board to fill vacancies that arise in between church conferences called for the purpose of electing Board members. Such interim appointments may be made only for a period of up to one year.

After prayer and reflection, the Executive Committee and Pastor Ginger unanimously agreed that we should ask Tracy Collins to serve out the remainder of Samantha's term, through June 30, 2019. The full Board affirmed the appointment at its meeting on September 25th. Tracy is a longterm member of the Personnel Committee and, in that capacity, served as a member of the Beaumont working group. He is involved in many of Foundry's ministries, including serving as a Foundry member at Annual Conference.

Noel Bravo, Co-Chair of Personnel has agreed to serve as chair of the Personnel Committee going forward.

Please pray for Samantha and Tracy in this transition. Also, please add words of support and gratitude for them and for all the members of the Board who serve generously throughout the year.
