Scripture is often thought of as a source for answers. Yet throughout the Bible we find question after question: How long, O Lord? Whom shall I send? Are you able? Why is my soul disquieted within me? Do you love me? Who is my neighbor? In this series, we zero in on questions that appear in the lectionary texts—not trying to provide easy answers, but to "live the questions" as poet Rainer Maria Rilke encouraged. We will explore scriptural questions in the hope that as we do, we might "gradually, without noticing it, live along some distant day into the answer." 




