When we gather for worship and ministry on the corner of 16th and P, we do so upon the sacred, traditional, and unceded lands of the Anacostan, Massawomack, Susquehanock, Piscataway, and Pomunkey peoples, who were forcibly removed from them to allow for English settlement. As occupiers of their territory, we recognize them as the original and perpetual stewards of this land and gratefully acknowledge our responsibility for a more honest recounting of our history that empowers us to work for the thriving of all people.

TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER: MICHAEL E. HILL, ED.D.

Dr. Michael E. Hill is a non-profit president and international educator who believes organizations can change the course of the world for the better through deep engagement with stakeholders, dynamic partnerships and staying focused on a big picture mission. He has served as the President of Chautauqua Institution since 2017. Prior to his appointment at Chautauqua, Dr. Hill served as President & Chief Executive Officer of Youth For Understanding USA, where he dramatically expanded and diversified programs. He coled a historic civil rights trip to Cuba with the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington, D.C.,



at the invitation of Mariela Castro, two weeks before diplomatic relations were restored between the U.S. and the island nation. An international educator, he has served as a panelist and speaker on issues surrounding international education and student educational exchange.

Dr. Hill has also served as Senior Vice President of External Affairs for United Cerebral Palsy. He previously led national development, communications and volunteer efforts for Washington National Cathedral as Executive Director for External Relations and held a similar role at The Washington Ballet. He began his career as a journalist, serving as a Dow Jones Newspaper Fund Fellow and as a Staff Correspondent for the Courier-Observer.

Dr. Hill holds a B.A. in journalism from St. Bonaventure, an M.A. in arts and cultural management from Saint Mary's University of Minnesota, and a Doctorate in Education from Vanderbilt University's Peabody College.




