NEW SERIES BEGINS JANUARY 14

A DREAM DEFERRED

But let justice roll down like water and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream. Amos 5:24



We invite you to join us on Sunday, January 14 at both our worship services as we kick off the new series *A Dream Deferred*. Our guest preacher will be Dr. Donyelle McCray, who serves as Associate Professor of Homiletics at Yale Divinity School. A teacher, writer, and Episcopal layperson, her scholarship focuses on ways African American women and lay people use the sermon to play, remember, invent, and disrupt. She is the author of *The Censored Pulpit: Julian of Norwich as Preacher,* a forthcoming volume on sermon genre, *Is it a Sermon?: Genre Fluidity and Ancestral Wisdom in African American Preaching,* and she is currently writing a book on the preaching and spirituality of the Rev. Dr. Pauli Murray. Before becoming a homiletics professor, Donyelle served as an attorney focusing on wills, trusts, and estates. This work raised existential questions that led her to seminary and then into ministry as a hospice chaplain. Human finitude, compassion, and interdependence remain central theological concerns in her scholarship.
