In a time when many voices claim certainty about truth, identity, and purpose, the church offers a different witness. Grounded in scripture, shaped by the United Methodist tradition, and committed to the work of justice and mercy, this series reclaims the clarity of Christian faith—not as ideology, but as a way of life. Together, we will remember who we are, what we stand for, and how we are called to live in the world today.

PART I — WHO WE ARE: The Heart of Christian Faith

In a culture that tells us our worth depends on success, power, or fear, the gospel speaks a different truth: we are beloved, called, connected, and sent. This first movement of the series explores the foundations of Christian identity and discipleship through the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

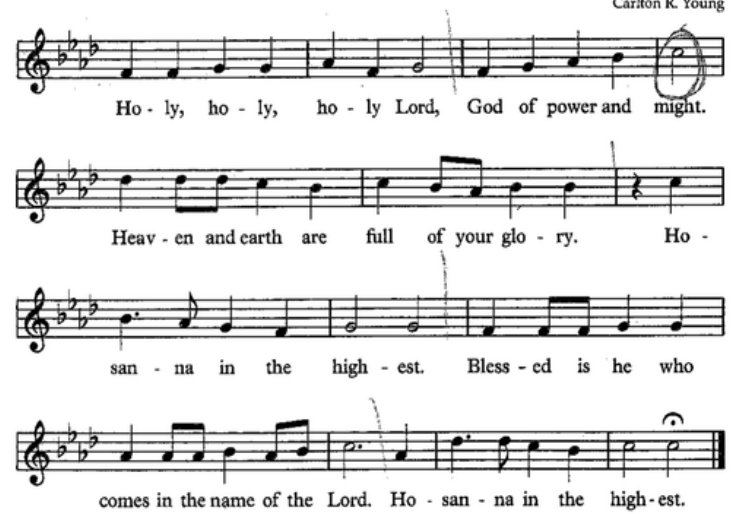

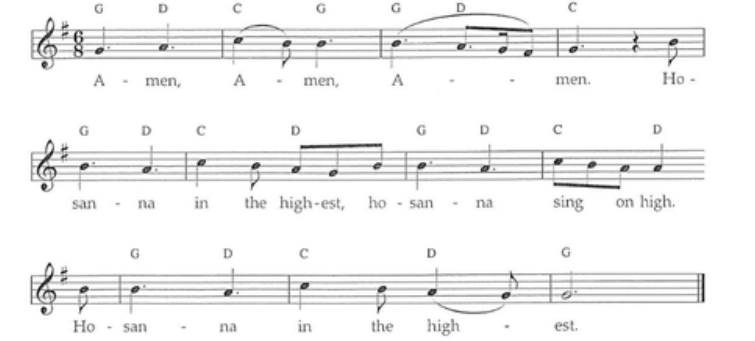
