When we gather for worship and ministry on the corner of 16th and P, we do so upon the sacred, traditional, and unceded lands of the Anacostan, Massawomack, Susquehanock, Piscataway, and Pomunkey peoples, who were forcibly removed from them to allow for English settlement. As occupiers of their territory, we recognize them as the original and perpetual stewards of this land and gratefully acknowledge our responsibility for a more honest recounting of our history that empowers us to work for the thriving of all people.

Grounded In Grace

Lent is a time to slow down, to reflect on our lives, and to contemplate how we might grow closer to Christ in our words and deeds. Throughout scripture, we are reminded in manifold metaphors that God is our safe space. God is our shelter; we dwell in the "shadow of God's wings," we are held in God's strong arms, God is our refuge and fortress, the solid rock that holds us firm, the lover in whose heart we abide. Like a seed that is planted in the earth to do its work of growth, we are held in God's grace to do ours. In this Lenten season, we will reflect on the gift of being grounded in grace, held and nourished to move ever closer to the light of Christ.

Recovery is a long process with some days being more challenging than others. One thing Linda has learned is that baking helps with that recovery. Linda's baked goods have been sold in neighborhood shops, served at Foundry meetings, and are now a regular part of our Sunday morning coffee hours at Foundry. We give thanks for the transformation we have witnessed, for the resilience that Linda and many others have shown on their path to recovery, and for the gift of journeying with them in faith and fellowship.
