Reaching For Connection

LENT 2024

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for God who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another...

Hebrews 10:23–25

"How does your soul prosper?" This is the central question asked in John Wesley's historic Class Meetings. In our day, we ask, "How is it with your soul?" The old language carries with it a sense not just of being but of growing. What is it that is spurring your soul to deepen, expand, shine? An answer offered by spiritual teachers through the ages is that connection is what we yearn for-connection with God, with others, with our true selves. Authentic connection is soul-expanding and life-giving. It makes us feel whole. But in our culture, there is much that disintegrates, divides, and depletes our soul. This Lent, we will consider how to return to God with our whole heart, with undivided lives, with prospering souls, nurtured through the connections God always provides.




SERMON DISCUSSION GROUP
